1. KNOW WHAT

TO THROW GARBAGE,

FOOD SCRAPS & YARD

TRIMMINGS **DO NOT** belong in

2. MAINTAIN A CLEAN STREAM!

Empty and/or wipe recyclable plastic, metal, and glass food containers. Make sure recyclables are clean and dry before placing in the proper RECYCLABLES cart/dumpster.

3. KEEP IT LOOSE! Keep recyclables loose inside your collection container. Recyclables in bags (especially opaque/black ones) are sorted out as garbage and end up in the landfill.

Sorting Tip! Keep an Eye on Size!

Corrugated cardboard and paper boxes should be flattened and large pieces cut to 3' x 3' or smaller. **Why?**

- Allows for more room in your cart or bin.
- Prevents litter and container overflow issues.
- Assures the pieces will fit in the hoppers of our trucks for safe and efficient collection of recyclables.

The Truth About
Cardboard

DID YOU KNOW?

- Recycling 1 ton of cardboard saves 46 gallons of oil AND 9 cubic yards of landfill space.
- Recycling cardboard takes only 75% of the energy needed to make new cardboard.

Recycling cardboard makes a big difference and it's easy, just flatten your boxes and cut down any large pieces before placing them inside your recycling container.

Sorting Makes a Difference!

We thank you for your efforts!

Milpitas residents are doing a great job of keeping most recyclable items out of the landfill through proper sorting. Some fine tuning will take recycling to the next level. Recent contamination monitoring in Milpitas showed that these items are frequently placed in the wrong containers:



Cardboard

1. Cardboard – A lot of cardboard gets wrongly thrown away in the garbage. To recycle clean, dry cardboard, place it in the blue recyclables container. If you have a container with a yellow lid, place the cardboard there.



Food Scraps

2. Food Scraps/Food-Soiled
Paper – Food scraps, food
soiled cardboard, food
soiled paper, and food soiled
napkins are often wrongly
thrown away in the garbage.
To ensure these items get
recycled, place them in
the brown food scraps
container.

Thank You For Starting Food Scrap Recycling Services!

As of January 2022, multi-family complexes are required to offer food scrap recycling services for residents. It's California Law! If your complex does not have food scraps services yet, please reach out to us at 408-988-4500 or bbettencourt@milpitassanitation. com. We can help you determine what type of food scraps services fit your needs. We can even meet with you on site! Non-compliance will lead to fines and penalties.
